Need for Educational Programming at Colebrookdale Railroad Surges

Given \$2,500 Boost from Ambler Savings Bank Donation

BOYERTOWN, PA – This month, 500 students at underprivileged schools, are being given an unmatched learning opportunity aboard the Colebrookdale Railroad. According to extensive research studies, '... children who take school trips have better grades (59%), higher graduation rates from high school (95%) and college (63%), and greater income (12% higher annually)'. This year, the need has exploded for local experiential learning opportunities and over 1,000 students are on the field trip waiting list until funding is garnered for transportation.

"Three key districts in our service area are walking only districts and we are seeking new contributors to help us fund transportation to allow the poorest districts to benefit from our programming," commented Michele Barrett, M. Ed., Director of Educational Programs of Colebrookdale Railroad Preservation Trust.

Ms. Barrett, once a classroom teacher, has developed elementary and middle school class curriculum, stretching field trips to the next level at Colebrookdale. Students get more than a day out of the classroom, they experience an immersive living lesson of the 19th Century and how railroads stimulated the economic development that enabled the United States to become one of the world's richest nation.

Donations like the one from Ambler Savings Bank, through the Pennsylvania Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) Program, allow school students to participate in their unique educational excursion program at no cost to the students or school districts.
