LIMERICK – Ambler Savings Bank Retail Officer, Erin Cohen, and Limerick Branch Manager, Becky Dice, presented the Spring-Ford School District with a check for \$15,000, which will be used to build and outfit the high school’s new maker space, including a multimedia room, in the senior high school’s media center.

The space will include two private instruction rooms and an open maker and breaker space. Chad Brubaker, Media Center Specialist, said the hope is that students and teachers will utilize the spaces to supplement in-classroom instruction, as well as create after school clubs that make use of the new spaces.

The donation from Ambler Savings Bank will be used to purchase additional 3D printers, sound mixing equipment, video equipment, and the supporting technology to outfit the MakerSpace.
